IRF update - The impact of grants from the <u>Indigenous</u> Reconciliation Fund in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon on children, on families, and on Indigenous language and culture was recently highlighted at a partnership appreciation event in the diocese of Saskatoon. A local Indigenous-led Discernment Circle has distributed grants to a number of projects over the past three years including Indigenous family wellness programming, summer literacy camps for children, a Cree language conference, nutrition support at St. Mary Wellness and Education Centre, a Nîkânîwin Leadership Program for youth, and a learning program for newcomers led by Elders and knowledge keepers at People's Bridge Advocacy. The diocese is within \$60,000 of reaching its \$1.25million commitment towards the five-year \$30-million national Indigenous Reconciliation Fund (IRF) established by the Catholic Bishops of Canada.
