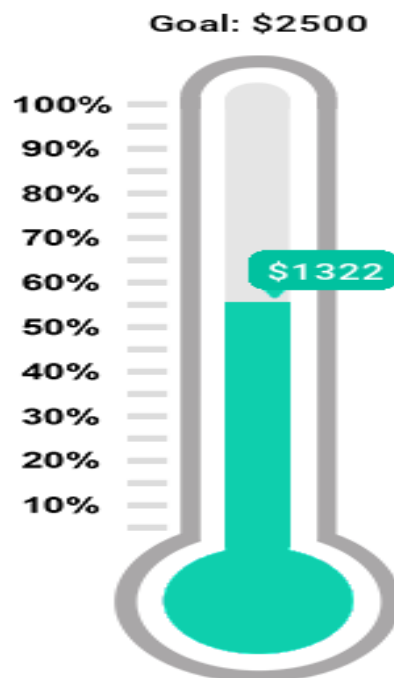

IRF update - The impact of grants from the [Indigenous Reconciliation Fund in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon](#) on children, on families, and on Indigenous language and culture was recently highlighted at a partnership appreciation event in the diocese of Saskatoon. A local Indigenous-led Discernment Circle has distributed grants to a number of projects over the past three years including Indigenous family wellness programming, summer literacy camps for children, a Cree language conference, nutrition support at St. Mary Wellness and Education Centre, a Nikânîwin Leadership Program for youth, and a learning program for newcomers led by Elders and knowledge keepers at People's Bridge Advocacy. The diocese is within \$60,000 of reaching its \$1.25-million commitment towards the five-year \$30-million [national Indigenous Reconciliation Fund \(IRF\)](#) established by the Catholic Bishops of Canada. Warning about “deep fake” AI posts on social media - Vatican News is warning about the circulation of “deep fake” videos and false social media posts purporting to feature statements by Pope Leo XIV. Be wary of accepting questionable materials at face value and carefully check sources. All the speeches and messages Pope Leo XIV has given since becoming pope on May 8 are available on the Vatican website, which should be checked before sharing supposed quotes and videos. The recently-revised Vatican website — www.vatican.va — offers all papal texts, including the texts of the Holy Father's video messages, in multiple languages.
